

The United States Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act of 1974 (FERPA) protects the rights to privacy for all students by placing certain restrictions on the disclosure of information contained in the student educational records.

This document allows you to authorize an instructor _____ (Faculty Name) and/or institution _____ (School Name) to disclose specific information from your educational record to be shared with the Faculty Submitted Student Work (FSSW) Exhibition sponsored by the ACM SIGGRAPH Education Committee. This information could then be available at the annual SIGGRAPH conference and on the Education Committee website archives.

Submission of the work you created as one of the best examples done for specific assignments in specific courses during the school year is an honor, but in order for your name to be included in the exhibit alongside your work you must give written authorization for your faculty/institution to release your name in association with the courses in which that work was created.

Check one of the following

- I authorize the inclusion of my name in association with my work and the courses and school in which they were created
- My work can be shown without my name included
- I prefer my work not be included at all

I understand that I have the right to change my decision in the future. These changes would prevent the future inclusion of my name or work but would not remove prior work already included.
